Location: Flat Tops Wilderness
White River National Forest
Near Stillwater Reservoir

Length: 25.79 mile loop (estimate using Nat'l Geo Mapping Software)

Time: Three to four night backpack with the option to stay longer. The average person hikes apx. 2 miles an hour. Adjust your time +/- based on terrain, trail and weather conditions and your skill and fitness level.

Elevation Gain/Loss: See trail profile on the reverse side

Difficulty: Moderate to strenuous

Trail Users: Hikers, stock animals and wildlife

Season: Mid to late June through August monsoon season

Dogs: Under owner's control

Permits: None required

Getting There from Denver: Take I-70 west to Wolcott. Take CO Highway 131 to Yampa. Get on County Road 7 (a.k.a. Forest Road 900) to Stillwater Reservoir and the Devil's Causeway Trapper's Lake Hooper-Keener trailhead.

Maps: National Geographic Trails Illustrated #150E, Devil's Causeway, Orno Peak and Trapper's Lake USGS 7.5 minute quadrangle maps. **IMPORTANT HINT:** Stay found with the aid of a topographic map, a compass, a GPS receiver and the skill to use them.

Safety Considerations & Supplemental Info: ■ You'll want to pack in plenty of water ■ The Chinese Wall trail is above treeline and exposed ■ Treat water that is drawn from sources along the trail ■ Check www.oriconline.org for fire restrictions ■ Be prepared for mosquitoes and black flies from June through September

Trail Description: Start at Trail #1119 heading southwest along Stillwater Reservoir. Turn right at the fork to stay on East Fork Trail #1119. Continue NW to Causeway Lake and then to Round Lake. Turn left at Round Lake to put you on Lost Lakes Trail #1116. Turn left at the next intersection to put you on the West Lost Lake Trail #1103. Turn left at the next intersection for Lost Lakes Trail #1812. Then turn left at the intersection for Chinese Wall Trail #1803. After exploring the Chinese Wall and Devil's Causeway return to Trail #1803. Follow this trail south to the next intersection. Turn left onto Bear River Trail #1120 and follow it to Stillwater Reservoir. Then, turn right onto Trail #1119 and follow it to your parked car. **SUGGESTION:** Contact the Yampa Ranger District for trail updates.

Highlights: ■ View of and from the Devil's Causeway ■ This area is known to hold the largest elk herd on the continent ■ Good fishing ■ The distinctive Chinese Wall
■ Proximity to numerous wilderness lakes ■ Alpine terrain

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


